- A student will have to secure overall 33% to be promoted. Thus, each student shall need to obtain at least 33 marks out of 100.
- It is mandatory for every student to appear at all the examinations. Quarterly, Half Yearly and Annual Examination in order to be eligible for promotion to the next class.
- The student has to pass separately in theory and practical with 33% marks in each part.
- In class XI a candidate securing less than 33% in one subject will be eligible to take supplementary examination in that subject.
- The candidate will be promoted to next higher class only if he/she secures 33% marks in that subject in the supplementary examination.
- However, if the student does not appear in supplementary examination due to medical and any other reason, he/she will not be eligible for promotion to next class.
- Grace marks (+5) only in one subject if pass in other four subject.
